2 Introduction

ARIS Accelerators for GDPR combine configurations, content, and method enhancements for ARIS Connect and ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager to speed up the implementation of General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) compliance projects.

Prerequisites

- ARIS Connect and ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager are running.
- All relevant runnables are in **STARTED** state.
- The **system** user has all required privileges. (The **system** user has all required privileges by default, unless an administrator revoked the privileges.)
- You have access to the unzipped data of **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-<version number>.<change list number>.zip** (Example: **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-10.0.6.1.1263081.zip**).

For detailed information, refer to the **GDPR Conventions for ARIS Accelerators** manual, **ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager Installation Guide**, and **ARIS Server Installation** guides.

3 Import and merge the GDPR method extension filter

Import and merge the **GDPR method extension** filter. It adds derived and user-defined method constructs (model types, object types, symbols, connection types, attribute type groups, and attribute types) to the ARIS method. These method constructs are required for GDPR regulation. All other accelerators are based on this enhanced ARIS method. To use the GDPR method extensions, use the **Entire method** filter or add the GDPR method extensions to any existing ARIS GRC filter. The GDPR method extension filter contains only additional enhancements for GDPR which are based on the GRC method. For detailed information on the GRC method, refer to the convention manuals delivered with ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager.

Prerequisites

See introduction (page 2).

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Architect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **ARIS** >  **Administration**. The **Administration** tab opens.
4. Click  **Navigation** in the bar panel if the **Navigation** bar is not activated yet.
5. Click  **Configuration** >  **Conventions**.
6. Right-click  **Filter**, then click  **Import filter**. The corresponding dialog opens.
7. Click **Browse**. The corresponding dialog opens.
8. Navigate to the directory in which the unzipped data of the **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-<version number>.<change list number>.zip (Example: ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-10.0.6.1.1263081.zip)** is stored.
9. Click **<GDPR accelerator>\Filter**, then select the file **GDPR method extension.filter**.
10. Click **Open**.
11. Click **OK**. The filter is imported into the tenant and added to the list of filters in ARIS Architect.
12. Merge the **GDPR method extension** filter with GRC filters in use, if necessary.
 - a. Right-click  **Filter**, then click **New** >  **Filter**. The Filter Wizard opens.
 - b. Enter a name for the filter, for example, **My filter (GDPR)**, and optionally enter a description.
 - c. Click **Next**.
 - d. Enable **Merge filters**.
 - e. Click **Next**.
 - f. Enable the filters to be merged, for example, **My filter** and **GDPR method extension**.
 - g. Click **Finish**.

The filter is created. It combines all settings of the merged filters.

Important: Now you must specify this filter as a method filter for your GDPR databases in ARIS Architect (database properties > **Palette and method filter** > **Method filter**).

4 Restore GDPR databases

Restore the GDPR databases for ARIS. They contain the complete GDPR regulation as an ARIS model as well as the required GDPR questionnaires (**Application System Qualification, GDPR Processing Activity Documentation (Controller), GDPR Processing Activity Documentation (Processor), GDPR Processing Activity Qualification, GDPR Data Protection Impact Assessment**).

Prerequisites

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Architect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **ARIS** >  **Explorer**. The **Explorer** tab opens.
4. Click  **Navigation** in the bar panel if the **Navigation** bar is not activated yet.
5. In the Explorer tree, right-click your connection to the ARIS Server, then select  **Restore Database**. The Restore Wizard opens.
6. Click **Select**.
7. Navigate to the directory in which the unzipped data of the **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-<version number>.<change list number>.zip (Example: ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-10.0.6.1.1263081.zip)** is stored.
8. Select the path **<GDPR accelerator>\Databases**.
9. Click the database file **GDPR questionnaires.adb**.
10. Click **Open**.
11. Click **Finish**.
12. Repeat these steps for the database file **GDPR regulation model.adb**.

The databases are available.

5 Import GDPR reports

The GDPR reports contain ARIS and ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager reports for internal and external use, such as the **Record of processing activities**, the **GDPR data protection impact assessment**, and the **GDPR management report**, or analyses such as the **Data allocation matrix** and the **Survey intelligence report**.

5.1 Import ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager reports

Import the GDPR reports that are to be run in ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager.

Prerequisites

See introduction (page 2).

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Architect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **ARIS** >  **Administration**. The **Administration** tab opens.
4. Click  **Navigation** in the bar panel if the **Navigation** bar is not activated yet.
5. Click  **Evaluations**.
6. Create a new category or import the reports into an existing category.
7. To create a new category, right-click **ARCM reports**, then select **New** > **Category**.
8. Enter a category name, for example, **GDPR**.
9. Click **OK**.
10. To import the reports, right-click the relevant category, then select  **Import script**. The corresponding dialog opens.
11. Navigate to the directory in which the unzipped data of the **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-<version number>.<change list number>.zip** (Example: **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-10.0.6.1.1263081.zip**) is stored.
12. Select the path **<GDPR accelerator>\Reports\ARCM reports**.
13. Select all reports (**Output GDPR data protection impact assessment.arx**, **Output extended GDPR management report.arx**, **Output GDPR management report.arx**, **Output record of processing activities.arx**, and **Output survey intelligence report.arx**).
14. Click **Open**. The **Import scripts in use** dialog opens and lists the scripts that the imported reports require in order to run. This dialog is displayed for every report to be imported. Therefore, repeat the next two steps for every report.
15. Enable all scripts in the dialog in order to import them along with the report.
16. Click **OK**.

The GDPR reports are imported.

Warning

If you modify the GDPR reports according to your requirements, save them with new names to make sure they are not overwritten by an update.

5.2 Import ARIS Architect reports

Import the GDPR report that is to be run in ARIS.

Prerequisites

See introduction (page 2).

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Architect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **ARIS** >  **Administration**. The **Administration** tab opens.
4. Click  **Navigation** in the bar panel if the **Navigation** bar is not activated yet.
5. Click  **Evaluations** > **Reports**.
6. Right-click **ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager**, then select  **Import script**. The corresponding dialog opens.
7. Navigate to the directory in which the unzipped data of the **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-<version number>.<change list number>.zip** (Example: **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-10.0.6.1.1263081.zip**) is stored.
8. Select the path **<GDPR accelerator>\Reports\Reports_ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager**.
9. Click the report **Data allocation matrix.arx**.
10. Click **Open**. The **Import scripts in use** dialog opens.
11. Enable all scripts in the dialog in order to import them with the report.
12. Click **OK**.

The GDPR report is imported.

Warning

If you modify the GDPR reports according to your requirements, save them with new names to make sure they are not overwritten by an update.

6 Import GDPR queries

Import the GDPR queries required by the data feeds of GDPR dashboards. Using these GDPR queries, you can output the database items as a data table. The GDPR queries are required for the predefined GDPR dashboards.

Prerequisites

Procedure


1. Start ARIS Architect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **ARIS** >  **Administration**. The **Administration** tab opens.
4. Click  **Analysis** >  **Queries**.
5. Right-click the **Private** folder.
6. Select **New** >  **Folder**.
7. Enter a name, for example, **GDPR**.
8. Right-click the **GDPR** folder, then select **Import query**. The corresponding dialog opens.
9. Navigate to the directory in which the unzipped data of the **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-<version number>.<change list number>.zip (Example: ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-10.0.6.1.1263081.zip)** is stored.
10. Select the path **<GDPR accelerator>\Dashboards\Octopus queries backup**.
11. Select all **.eqi** files.
12. Click **Import query**.
13. Click **Next**.
14. Select the **GDPR** folder, then click **Finish**.
15. Click **OK**. The queries are imported.
16. In the Explorer tree, click the **GDPR** folder.
17. Select all query files.
18. Right-click the selection, then click  **Publish**. The Publish query dialog opens.
19. Click **New group**.
20. Enter the name **GDPR**.
21. Click **OK**.

The GDPR queries are imported and published. The public query folder **GDPR** contains the imported queries.

Note

You can identify queries by their GUID. To check the GUID of a query, move the mouse pointer over the query. When queries are published, duplicates with a new GUID are created in the **Private** folder. To avoid errors, delete the duplicates in the **Private** folder.

7 Create a GDPR impact type in ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager

You can assess a risk in ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager based on various impact types. The GDPR impact type is used for risks related to processing activities. The data protection officer uses the GDPR impact type to decide whether or not a processing activity involves a high risk for a data subject.

Prerequisites

- See introduction (page 2).
- You have the **System administrator** role.

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager.
2. Click  **Administration**.
3. Under **System management**, click **System**.
4. Click **Risk Management**. The form is displayed.
5. Click **+** **New** in the **Impact types** row. The **Create impact type** dialog opens.
6. Select **No template (create new impact type)**.
7. Click **OK**. The **Impact type** form opens.
8. Enter a name for the impact type, for example, **GDPR impact**.
9. Assign impact and frequency values for the qualitative assessment () or create new ones (**+**).
10. If you want risk scores to be calculated, add weightings to the values.
11. Click a cell in the value matrix to specify the color in which the impact type is to be displayed in the risk matrix (qualitative).
12. Click **OK**.
13. Edit the optional fields. Enter a description, for example.
14. Click  **Save**.

The GDPR impact type is created.

8 Install ARIS Connect accelerators

ARIS Accelerators for GDPR include GDPR dashboards for ARIS Aware and an enhanced version of the ARIS Connect **classic configuration** set for easy and standardized gathering of data on processing activities. By using the enhanced ARIS Connect fact sheets for GDPR, multiple individuals in an organization can easily contribute to the GDPR project. ARIS Aware dashboards for GDPR provide:

- A transparent overview of the processing activities of each organizational unit.
- The status and the results of GDPR surveys and GDPR risk assessments.
- The issues that need to be addressed according to the results of the data protection impact assessment.

The ARIS Connect accelerators are delivered as a complete ARIS Connect configuration and, additionally, as a delta file. You can use the delta file if you use an individual configuration of ARIS Connect. The installation of the complete ARIS Connect configuration is described in this manual. If you want to use the delta file, contact your ARIS service team.

8.1 Import GDPR dashboards

Import GDPR dashboards into the ARIS Connect repository.

Prerequisites

See introduction (page 2).

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Connect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click  **Repository**.
4. Click **Dashboards & Data feeds**.
5. Click  **Import**. The corresponding dialog opens.
6. Click **Select import file**.
7. Navigate to the directory in which the unzipped data of the **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-<version number>.<change list number>.zip** (Example: **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-10.0.6.1.1263081.zip**) is stored.
8. Select the path **<GDPR accelerator>\Dashboards\AWARE export**.
9. Click any file, for example, **GDPR+-+Overview.zip**. The file is in **ZIP** format and contains one dashboard and the relevant data feeds. The file also includes the dashboard permissions.
10. Click **Open**. The **File upload** dialog is closed.
11. To replace the dashboards available in the repository, enable **Overwrite if already exists**.
12. To import the dashboard permissions contained in the dashboard file, enable **Import privileges**. This option is activated by default.
13. Click **Import**.
14. Repeat steps 9 - 13 for all other dashboard files.

Note: If you import all GDPR dashboards, an **Import result** dialog is displayed, warning you that imported data feeds already exist. The same data feeds are partly contained in multiple dashboards. You can close this dialog because this is not a problem.

The **GDPR** dashboards and the related data feeds are imported. All dashboards are displayed in the **Dashboards** list. The data feeds are displayed under **Data Feeds**.

8.2 Provide the GDPR configuration


Provide the GDPR configuration for ARIS Connect and ARIS Server.

Prerequisites

See introduction (page 2).

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Cloud Controller on your ARIS Server. For detailed information on ARIS Cloud Controller, refer to the **Cloud Controller (ACC) Command-Line Tool** guide.
2. Use the command **stop copernicus_m** to stop the runnable **copernicus_m**.
3. Use the command **stop abs_m** to stop the runnable **abs_m**.
4. Use the command **list** to make sure the runnables have the status **STOPPED**.
5. Start Windows Explorer.
6. Navigate to the directory in which the unzipped data of the **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-<version number>.<change list number>.zip** (Example: **ARIS Accelerators for GDPR-10.0.6.1.1263081.zip**) is stored.
7. Select the path **<GDPR accelerator>\Configuration sets\cop_complete_classicGDPR**, then copy the folder **classicGDPR**.
8. Paste the folder from the clipboard to the **Copernicus** directory **<ARIS installation folder>\ARIS10.0\server\bin\work\work_copernicus_m\base\webapps\ROOT\WEB-INF\config**.
9. Select the path **<GDPR accelerator>\ Configuration sets\abs_complete_classicGDPR**, then copy the folder **classicGDPR**.
10. Paste the folder from the clipboard to the **ABS** directory **<ARIS installation folder>\ARIS10.0\server\bin\work\work_abs_m\base\webapps\abs\WEB-INF\config**.
The **config** folder now appears as follows. If you have additional ARIS Connect data, the content of this folder may differ.

11. Use the command **start copernicus_m** to start the runnable **copernicus_m**.
12. Use the command **start abs_m** to start the runnable **abs_m**.
13. Use the command **list** to check the correct status of the runnables (**STARTED**).

The **classicGDPR** modification set is available. Now you can activate the GDPR configuration and provide the GDPR dashboards.

8.3 Activate the GDPR configuration

Create and activate the GDPR configuration for ARIS Connect.

Prerequisites

- See introduction (page 2).
- The **classicGDPR** configuration is available. For detailed information, refer to **Provide the GDPR configuration for ARIS Connect and ARIS Server** (page 13).

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Connect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **<user name> > Administration**. The **ARIS Administration** opens.
4. Click **Manage configuration sets**. The current configuration set is marked as (active).
5. Move the mouse pointer over the **classicGDPR** modification set.
6. Click  **Activate**. The **classicGDPR** modification set is marked as **(active)**.

If the **classicGDPR** modification set modification set is not yet displayed, refresh the modification sets. To do so, enter **<your ARIS Server>/<your tenant>/reloadConfig** in a new browser window, then click **Reload and validate configuration files**. Close this browser window and return to the previous browser window.

7. Click **Create** in the **Configuration and modification sets** area. The **Create modification set** dialog opens.
8. Enter the name for the modification set, for example, **classicGDPR_dashboards**.
9. Select the **classicGDPR** template.
10. Click **Create**. The modification set is created. It contains all elements from the selected template.
11. Move the mouse pointer over the newly created modification set, for example, **classicGDPR_dashboards**.
12. Click  **Activate**. The **classicGDPR_dashboards** modification set is marked as **(active)**.

The GDPR configuration for ARIS Connect is created and activated.

8.4 Provide the GDPR dashboards

Activate the GDPR dashboards for ARIS Connect.

Prerequisites

- See introduction (page 2).
- Your ARIS Server is enabled for ARIS Aware, that is, the **dashboarding** runnable is activated and running. For detailed information, refer to the **ARIS Server Installation Guide**.
- A valid server license for **Aware (YCSAW) ARIS Connect Server** extension pack is available in ARIS Administration.
- The **classicGDPR_dashboards** modification set is available.

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Connect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **<user name> > Administration**. The **ARIS Administration** opens.
4. Click **Manage configuration sets**. The **classicGDPR_dashboards** modification set is marked as (active).
5. Move the mouse pointer over the **classicGDPR_dashboards** modification set and click  **Edit**. The **Define modification set** page opens.
6. Click **Fact sheets**. All items available for fact sheets are displayed.
7. Navigate to the **orgUnit** item.
8. Move the mouse pointer over the **orgUnit** item and click  **Edit**. The **Subordinate sheets (content)** page opens. The items in the different areas are displayed.
9. Move the mouse pointer over **Dashboards** and click  **Edit**. The **Dashboards** page opens.
10. Click **Add**. The **Add Dashboard** dialog opens. All imported GDPR dashboards are displayed (page 12).
11. Copy the name of the relevant dashboard, for example, **GDPR – Overview**.
12. Paste **GDPR – Overview** from the clipboard to the **Name** field of the relevant languages.
13. Enable the databases that are to display the dashboard.
14. Select the dashboard that is to be added to the list of dashboards, for example, **GDPR – Overview**.
15. Click **Add**.
16. Repeat steps 10 - 15 for the other dashboards (**GDPR – Workflow**, **GDPR - DPIA Answers (organizational units)**, **GDPR - DPIA Issues (organizational units)**).
17. Click  **Back** until **Define modification set** is displayed.
18. Navigate to the **procActivityDetails** item.

19. Move the mouse pointer over the **procActivityDetails** item and click  **Edit**. The **Subordinate sheets (content)** page opens. The items in the different areas are displayed.
20. Click **Add**.
21. Select **Dashboards** from the list of Subordinate sheets.
22. Click **Add**.
23. Move the mouse pointer over **Dashboards** and click  **Edit**. The **Dashboards** page opens.
24. Repeat steps 10 – 15 for the dashboards **GDPR – DPIA Answers (processing activities)** and **GDPR – DPIA Issues (processing activities)**.
25. Click  **Back** until **Configuration and modification sets** is displayed.

The GDPR dashboards are available. For detailed information on the administration of dashboards, refer to the chapter **Administrate dashboards ARIS Aware** in the online help for ARIS Connect.

8.5 Create a GDPR Dashboard user group in ARIS Connect

Create a new user group for GDPR Dashboard users. You can assign dashboard access privileges through the group or directly to the user. The type of assignment is displayed in user management.

Prerequisites

See introduction (page 2).

Procedure

1. Start ARIS Connect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **<user name> > Administration**. The **ARIS Administration** opens.
4. Click  **User management**, and select **User groups**. The list of user groups opens.
5. Click  **Add user group**.

Enter the name **GDPR Dashboard**. You must use exactly this group name to make sure the dashboards are displayed to the assigned users. If a user group that already exists in the LDAP system is created, the user group names must match. This is the only way to assign an existing ARIS user group with the LDAP user group.

6. Enter an optional description.
7. Click **Save**. The user group is created.
8. Click **Associated users**.
9. Click  **Edit assignment**. The **Associate users** dialog opens.
10. Add all users you want to assign to the group. Use the  **Filter** to limit the list of users, based on specific search criteria.

Enable the check boxes of the relevant items in the box of the available items, and click  **Add**. The items are transferred to the box of the associated items. To remove users/user groups from the **Associated users/user groups** box, enable the check boxes of the relevant users/user groups in this box, and click  **Remove**.

The **GDPR Dashboard** user group is created with the relevant users. The associated users can now use the GDPR dashboards.

Tip

To associate all available items, click  **Add all**, and click  **Remove all** to remove all associations.

8.6 Define a URL alias for the GDPR dashboards

Defining a URL alias for the GDPR dashboards enables you to shorten the link used in dashboards and data feeds. If you use an alias, you do not have to enter the entire URL, but only the path to the location where the data is stored. The URL aliases are required by the GDPR dashboards.

Prerequisites

- See introduction (page 2).
- Your ARIS Server is enabled for ARIS Aware that is, the **dashboarding** runnable is activated and running (see **ARIS Server Installation Guide** or **ARIS Cloud Controller (ACC) Command-Line Tool**).
- A valid server license for **Aware (YCSAW) ARIS Connect Server** extension pack is available in ARIS Administration.


Procedure

1. Start ARIS Connect.
2. Log in as **system** user.
3. Click **<user name> > Administration**. The **ARIS Administration** opens.
4. Click **Dashboards**.
5. Click **+ Add configuration**. The **Add property** dialog opens.
6. Enter the following properties:
 - a. Name: **ARIS**
It is important to use exactly this name, to make sure the dashboards are displayed.
 - b. Protocol: **http**
 - c. Host: <name of your server>
 - d. Port: <load balancer port>
 - e. User: **system**
 - f. Password: <password of the **system** user>
7. Click **Save**.
8. Repeat these steps for the **ARCM** URL alias. Use the same properties except for the **User** and **Password** fields, which remain empty.

The URL aliases for the GDPR dashboards **ARIS** and **ARCM** are defined.

All ARIS Accelerators for GDPR are now installed and ready to use.

9 Glossary

GDPR

The **General Data Protection Regulation** (GDPR) protects the rights of individuals' personal data within the European Union. It also regulates the export of personal data outside the EU. GDPR is a regulation by the European Parliament, the Council of the European Union, and the European Commission.

PROCESSING ACTIVITY

A processing activity is any operation which is performed on individuals' personal data, such as collection, recording, disclosure by transmission, and therefore is subject to the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR (page 19)).

Processing activities and associated information are modeled in **Processing activity description diagram** models and **Record of processing activities** models in ARIS Architect. For detailed information, refer to the **ARIS Risk & Compliance Manager - Data Protection Management** guide.

10.3 Disclaimer

ARIS products are intended and developed for use by persons. Automated processes, such as the generation of content and the import of objects/artifacts via interfaces, can lead to an outsized amount of data, and their execution may exceed processing capacities and physical limits. For example, processing capacities are exceeded if models and diagrams transcend the size of the modeling area or an extremely high number of processing operations is started simultaneously. Physical limits may be exceeded if the memory available is not sufficient for the execution of operations or the storage of data.

Proper operation of ARIS products requires the availability of a reliable and fast network connection. Networks with insufficient response time will reduce system performance and may cause timeouts.

If ARIS products are used in a virtual environment, sufficient resources must be available there in order to avoid the risk of overbooking.

The system was tested using scenarios that included 100,000 groups (folders), 100,000 users, and 1,000,000 modeling artifacts. It supports a modeling area of 25 square meters.

If projects or repositories are larger than the maximum size allowed, a powerful functionality is available to break them down into smaller, more manageable parts.

Some restrictions may apply when working with process administration, ARIS Administration, ARIS document storage, and ARIS Process Board, and when generating executable processes. Process Governance has been tested and approved for 1000 parallel process instances. However, the number may vary depending on process complexity, for example, if custom reports are integrated.

ARIS document storage was tested with 40.000 document items. This includes documents, document versions or folders. We recommend monitoring the number and overall size of stored document items and archiving some document items if needed.
