Overview

This document describes how to install webMethods EDI Module 6.5.2 into an webMethods Integration Server 7.1 environment.

If you are installing the webMethods EDI Module at the same time you are installing other webMethods products, such as the webMethods Integration Server, see the *webMethods Installation Guide* for instructions on installing those products.

Requirements

Supported Platforms and Operating Systems

The EDI Module supports the same platforms as its host Integration Server.

The webMethods EDI Module uses the same JDK as its host Integration Server.

Required webMethods Products

The table below lists the webMethods products you must install before or at the same time you install the EDI Module. The table also lists the webMethods products you must install at some point for the EDI Module to operate fully.

Required for Installation	Required for Operation
Integration Server 7.1	webMethods Developer 7.1
Trading Networks Server 7.1	Trading Networks Console 7.1

Software Requirements

The EDI Module has no software requirements beyond those of its host Integration Server.

Hardware Requirements

The EDI Module has no hardware requirements beyond those of its host Integration Server.

Install the webMethods EDI Module

Install the webMethods EDI Module 6.5.2 on the Integration Server. The installer will automatically install the EDI Module in the Integration Server installation directory.

- 1 Download the latest webMethods Installer from the webMethods Advantage Web site at <http://advantage.webmethods.com> and start the installer.
- 2 Specify the installation directory as the webMethods installation directory (by default, webMethods7).
- 3 In the product selection list, navigate to eStandards ► webMethods EDI Module 6.5.2 and select the desired products:
 - Program Files (Required). Contains the program files for this module.
 - Documentation (Optional). Contains the documentation for this module.
 - Any required webMethods components you have not installed.
- 4 Review the list of components you selected to install.
- 5 The installer installs the selected components.

Uninstall the webMethods EDI Module



Important! This section provides only instructions that are specific to uninstalling the EDI Module. For complete instructions on using the webMethods Installer, see the *webMethods Installation Guide*.

- 1 Shut down the Integration Server that hosts the EDI Module.
- 2 Start the webMethods Uninstaller, as follows:

System	Action
Windows	In the Add or Remove Programs window, select <i>webMethods release installation_directory</i> as the program to uninstall, where <i>release</i> and <i>installation_directory</i> are the release and installation directory of the Integration Server on which the EDI Module is installed.
Unix	Navigate to the <i>webMethods_directory/bin</i> directory of the installation that includes the Integration Server on which the EDI Module is installed and enter <code>uninstall (wizard)</code> or <code>uninstall -console</code> (console mode).

- 3 In the product list, select eStandards ► webMethods EDI Module 6.5.2.
- 4 The uninstaller removes all EDI Module-related files that were installed into the *Integration Server_directory/packages* directory. The uninstaller does not delete files created after you installed the EDI Module (for example, user-created or configuration files), nor does it delete the directory structure that contains the files.
- 5 If you do not want to save the files the uninstaller did not delete, navigate to the *Integration Server_directory/packages/WmEDI* and *Integration Server_directory/packages/WmEDIforTN* directories and delete the subdirectories.
