Workbench Enhancements

■ DCOM Wrapper

The DCOM Wrapper now supports Microsoft Visual Studio 2012 and 2013 in addition to the already supported Visual Studio versions.

■ Integration Server Wrapper

The wrapper no longer creates the `<IDL>_IS.properties` file. Existing property files are ignored.

■ Enhanced Null Value Suppression

A new button in the XML Mapping Editor **Overview Page** enables you to set the current null value suppression settings to all mappings. See *Overview Page* under *Using the XML Mapping Editor*.

■ COBOL MPO Support

The *IDL Extractor for COBOL* - together with the EntireX Adapter or EntireX RPC Servers - supports the concept of multiple possible output (MPO). This means that the output structure returned is decided by the COBOL server at runtime; the COBOL layout on output varies. For examples of such a COBOL server using the DFHCOMMAREA calling convention (the most commonly used interface type), see *COBOL Server Using Multiple Possible Output (MPO)* and *COBOL Server Using Optional Output*. For other interface types, see *COBOL Mapping Editor*.

■ COBOL Server Using Fixed-length Tables in Variable Manner

The *IDL Extractor for COBOL* - together with the CICS RPC Server, the EntireX Adapter with IMS Connect connections, or the IMS Connect RPC Server - supports COBOL server programs that use the data length of their interface to process a variable number of array elements in a fixed-size COBOL table. For more information see the example *COBOL Server Using Fixed-length Tables in Variable Manner* provided for the interface types

- CICS Large Buffer with Same | Different CICS Message Structure on Input and Output (see Note)
- CICS Channel Container
- IMS MPP (IMS Connect)



Note: COBOL server programs use either the same data structure on input and output, or overlay the input data structure with a different output data structure. See *COBOL Mapping Editor*.

Java Wrapper

When generating Java RPC clients (Bean-compliant) with the Java Wrapper, the name generation rules have changed slightly to ensure greater consistency. This means a name used for more than one IDL group parameter with different content is always changed. See example below.

Sample IDL file:

```
LIBRARY 'example' is
PROGRAM 'progA' is
  DEFINE DATA PARAMETER
    1 groupparm IN
    2 parm (A10)
  END-DEFINE

PROGRAM 'progB' is
  DEFINE DATA PARAMETER
    1 groupparm OUT
    2 parm (I4)
  END-DEFINE
```

➤ **To migrate an application that needs to be regenerated**

- If you have to migrate an application that needs to be regenerated because of a change to the IDL file, figure out the affected class name and rename the generated Java class to the old name

Or:

Adapt your application to the new name.

IDL Extractor for WSDL

Prefix name assigning has been enhanced to ensure consistent generation of XML mapping files. If more than one prefix is associated with a URL, the last prefix (in alphabetical order) is used. For example, the WSDL contains following namespace definition:

```
xml:sampleNamespace="http://sample.org"
```

and

```
xml:anotherNamespace="http://sample.org"
```

In this case, prefix `sampleNamespace` is used (comes after `anotherNamespace` in alphabetical order).

This has no influence on the namespace used in the XML/SOAP document. If your application has such a case and the receiving web service expects a specific prefix name (because it does not check the namespace), open the XML Mapping Editor and change the prefix on affected elements and attributes.

Encryption

For encrypted transport, instead of using the encryption/decryption mechanism provided by EntireX Security, we strongly recommend using the Secure Sockets Layer/Transport Layer Security protocol. See *SSL/TLS and Certificates with EntireX*.

SSL/TLS using AT-TLS on z/OS and ATLS on z/VSE

ATLS support has been added to EntireX version 9.6.0 for z/VSE. Prerequisites:

- EntireX Broker 9.6.0 for z/VSE
- EntireX Fix 11 for z/VSE
- BSI stack 256pre13 or newer

Various documentation sections dealing with SSL/TLS support have been reworked:

- for platform z/OS, sections have been added to set up AT-TLS (Application Transparent Transport Layer Security)
- for platform z/VSE, sections have been added to set up ATLS (Automatic Transport Layer Security)

Command Central

With the Software AG's Command Central you can configure, manage, and administer one or more installations of the webMethods product suite in your enterprise. EntireX supports Command Central for EntireX Broker instances running on Linux, UNIX or Windows. They must have been created with version EntireX 9.9 by

- System Management Hub (SMH)
- Command Central (CC)

- command line (SMH, CC, or Broker command-line utility `etbsrv`)

You can start, stop and configure EntireX Broker instances from a single location, using the Command Central user interface or from a command line. Basic monitoring KPIs for EntireX Broker instances can be seen from the UI.

Software AG Command Central Help is available as a PDF guide on the Empower website/Tech-Communities, and as online HTML help that you access from the product (**Administrator > Help** in the Command Central user interface).

EntireX Adapter Enhancements

■ Listeners Information

A new information screen provides statistics about the listeners of the EntireX Adapter. See *Listeners Information* in the EntireX Adapter documentation.

■ License Handling

License handling for EntireX Broker connections now better reflects the EntireX pricing model:

- A license status line has been introduced for EntireX Broker connections (ACI connections or normal RPC connections).
- A warning message is given in the case of a possible license coverage mismatch.

■ COBOL MPO Support

The EntireX Adapter - together with the *IDL Extractor for COBOL* - supports the concept of multiple possible output (MPO). See *Workbench Enhancements* in the EntireX Release Notes.

■ Services for Creating Document Types, Flows and IDL Files

■ New Namespace of Service `putDocDataToPipeline`

Compatibility with webMethods Suite Naming Conventions

The name of the UNIX start/stop script for the EntireX Broker Administration Service has changed to comply with webMethods suite naming conventions:

where <n> is a sequential, installation-dependent number and

99 is the EntireX version (major and minor version number)

- in directory *etc/init.d*: from `sag<n>etbsrv` to `sag<n>exx99`

- in directory *EntireX/bin*: from `sag<n>etbsrv` to `sagexx`

Running the XML/SOAP RPC Server in the Software AG Runtime

After installation, the default XML/SOAP RPC Server using Broker "localhost:1971" and server address "RPC/XMLSERVER/CALLNAT" is no longer started automatically. See *Running the XML/SOAP RPC Server in the Software AG Runtime* in the UNIX and Windows administration documentation.

Optimized Trace File Handling

Trace file handling has been enhanced to avoid a constantly growing ETB.LOG file. The trace is written to file ETB.LOG until `TRACE-FILE-SIZE` has been reached and a new file is opened. The number of files defined in `MAX-TRACE-FILES` is kept in addition to the current ETB.LOG file. See *Trace File Handling* in the UNIX and Windows administration documentation and also `MAX-TRACE-FILES` and `TRACE-FILE-SIZE` under *Broker Attributes*.

Application Monitoring Data Collector

The Application Monitoring Data Collector has been enhanced to provide a callback functionality for the processing of incoming events. See *Callback User Exit*.

Logging Exit for EntireX Scripting Commands

Since version 9.7, EntireX has provided a set of command-line scripts with which, for example, you can monitor your environment and check that all components (broker, RPC servers) are up and running. See *Monitoring EntireX with Command-line Scripts*. With this version, an optional logging exit is provided. This is called every time a component in the environment is checked; results can be written to a CSV file. You can use the sample script `log_environment.bat` as a template. See *Logging Exit* under *Monitoring your Environment*.

EntireX Mini Runtime

The functionality provided by the EntireX Mini Runtime of EntireX version 9.7 and below is now delivered as a separate component under **Infrastructure > Libraries > EntireX Libraries** in the Software AG Installer. See Software AG documentation *Installing webMethods and Intelligent Business Operations Products*. After installation you will find the files at the following locations:

UNIX `<inst_root>/common/EntireX/lib`

Windows 32-bit `<inst_root>\common\EntireX\exx_32\bin`

Windows 64-bit `<inst_root>\common\EntireX\exx_32\bin` (for the 32-bit versions) and
`<inst_root>\common\EntireX\exx_64\bin` (for the 64-bit versions)

Set Application Name with .NET Wrapper

For accounting purposes, a new property `ApplicationName` has been introduced for the .NET Wrapper. Set this property before calling one of the Logon methods if you want to replace the default application name. See `ApplicationName` under class `Broker` in the .NET Wrapper documentation.

OpenSSL Support

The OpenSSL Project has announced it will no longer support version 0.9.8 from December 31, 2015. EntireX now supports OpenSSL version 1.0.1. The default configuration is now:

```
CIPHER-SUITE=FIPS+kRSA:!ADH:!NULL:!EXP:!DES:!MD5:!PSK:!RC4:@STRENGTH
```

Server Mapping Files for COBOL

If a COBOL server is wrapped with the *COBOL Wrapper* or extracted with the *IDL Extractor for COBOL*, a server mapping file is automatically created if required. Previous versions of EntireX support server-side mapping files (extension .svm) for COBOL only. These files need to be deployed to the target RPC server. This version supports client-side mapping files (extension .cvm) as an alternative. This simplifies the handling of server mapping files. This can be an important criterion, for example if the RPC server is hosted in a mainframe environment and you do not have access to mainframe development resources. The following tasks are not required:

- deploying the server mapping files to the RPC server
- setting up a server-side mapping container in the mainframe environment
- change management of server-side mapping files in the mainframe environment

Server-side mapping files can be migrated to client-side mapping files, see *Migrating Server Mapping Files*. Please note that client-side mapping files are not supported by RPC clients generated with the *DCOM Wrapper* and *COBOL Wrapper*. For more information on server mapping files, see *Server Mapping Files for COBOL*.

RPC Server/Listener Changes and Enhancements

■ CICS RPC Server User Exit

The CICS RPC user exit COBUEx02 provides the maximum expected length of output data (reply) before calling the target CICS program. See fields *CHAIN-COUNTER-OUT* under *Administering the CICS RPC Server* and *CHAIN-POINTER-OUT* under *Administering the CICS RPC Server* of the user exit API under *User Exit COBUEx02*.

■ WebSphere MQ Listener

MQ messages in text format are now supported. In addition to MQ messages in XML or SOAP format, the WebSphere MQ Listener can now process MQ messages in text format. The message layout is described by an IDL file. See *Administering the WebSphere MQ Listener*.

The handling of the `correlationId` and the `messageId` in synchronous request/reply scenarios has been changed. See *Support for Synchronous Request/Reply Scenarios* under *Advanced WebSphere MQ Listener Functionality*.

z/OS Broker in 64-bit Addressing Mode

EntireX Broker under z/OS now runs in 64-bit addressing mode (AMODE). Earlier versions ran in 31-bit mode, which meant you could address up to 2 GB of storage locations. This limit is referred to as "the bar". 64-bit mode takes EntireX Broker above the bar and means that up to 16 EB (exabytes) can be addressed. This increase in capacity makes it possible to send and receive an almost unlimited amount of messages. The maximum size of a single message is still limited to 2 GB.

The attribute file does not need to be changed for the 64-bit Broker. The one exception here is `PSTORE-VERSION`. See [PSTORE-VERSION for Persistent Store of Type DIV](#) under *Other Changes and Enhancements* below.

All user exits for conversion and translation run unchanged in 31-bit mode. However, if you have written your own security exits, these need to be 64-bit-enabled.

Application Monitoring

Application Monitoring is an EntireX feature that enables you to monitor the response times in your distributed applications, and it also enables you to monitor certain error situations. The EntireX Application Monitoring Data Collector collects the response time data of each involved software component of selected synchronous EntireX RPC services. The Application Monitoring Data Collector stores the KPI values in CSV (comma-separated values) files. The files can be processed by any tool that supports CSV files. A sample MashApp is also provided.

Application Monitoring was previously offered as part of the Software AG product Optimize for Infrastructure.

See *Application Monitoring*.

Support of Long N/NU/P/PU Data Types

The maximum number of digits for IDL data types N, NU, P and PU has been increased from 29 to 99, and the restriction of 7 digits after the decimal point no longer applies. See *IDL Data Types* under *Software AG IDL File* in the IDL Editor documentation.

Depending on your target programming language (endpoint) the supported number of digits is more restricted. If you connect two endpoints, the total number of digits used must be lower than or equal to the maxima of both endpoints. For the supported total number of digits for endpoints, see the notes under data types N, NU, P and PU under *Mapping Software AG IDL Data Types* in the respective Wrapper or language-specific documentation.

New .NET Wrapper class `BigNumeric` is provided. This is an implementation of decimal values without upper and lower limit and a default number of 99 digits after the decimal sign. See *BigNumeric* under *.NET Wrapper Reference*.

ETBINFO Enhancements

Command-line Enhancements

Multiple enhancements have been made to the command-line utility `etbinfo` under UNIX and Windows:

- If an error occurs, the long text of an error message is generated, corresponding to *Error Messages and Codes*. See command-line parameter `--longmsg` in the respective section of the documentation in the respective Administration documentation.
- Output of `SERVICE` objects can be limited to broker-internal or external services. See command-line parameter `--external` and `--internal` in the respective section of the documentation.
- You can execute an RPC ping to a specified RPC service. If the service is running, return code 0 and a corresponding text are returned. If the service is not running, a return code other than 0 is given. The RPC ping command is sent to the specified server via a specified broker, which can be either local or remote. See command-line parameter `--pingrpc` in the respective section of the documentation.

See also `etbinfo` in section *Broker Command-line Utilities* in the respective section of the Administration documentation.

Timestamp

With new profile parameters `%DATE` and `%TIME` you can put a timestamp on your `etbinfo` output. See *Profile* in section *Command-line Parameters* in the respective section of the documentation.

Monitoring EntireX with Command-line Scripts

EntireX provides a set of command-line scripts for common administration tasks:

- You can now show details of a specified or default broker and the active external services registered to it.
- You can now monitor - at a specified interval - your standard broker, registered services and clients that call your broker. Output is written to a CSV file.
- You can check easily whether all brokers and services of a defined environment are active. Checks are performed that a specified service is registered with the broker, and an RPC ping command is used to verify that a specified server can be called.

You can select the scripts from the EntireX Command-line Scripts Menu or call the individual scripts from the command line. See *Monitoring EntireX with Command-line Scripts*.

Mapping Arrays (Fixed <-> Unbounded) with the IDL Extractor for COBOL

With the context menu of the IDL Extractor for COBOL you can map a fixed-size COBOL table to a fixed-size or unbounded IDL array.

See for example *Set Arrays (Fixed <-> Unbounded)* under *CICS with DFHCOMMAREA Large Buffer Interface - In different to Out* in the IDL Extractor for COBOL documentation.

This is needed to support COBOL server programs that use the data length of their interface to process a variable number of array elements in a fixed-size COBOL table. See *COBOL Server Using Fixed-length Tables in Variable Manner* under [COBOL Support](#).

Enhanced Null Value Suppression

A new button in the XML Mapping Editor **Overview Page** enables you to set the current null value suppression settings to all mappings. See *Overview Page* under *Using the XML Mapping Editor*.

COBOL Mapping Editor

The COBOL Mapping Editor has been redesigned with a workflow-oriented user interface and the look-and-feel of the Natural Mapping Editor. Extracting the COBOL interface and designing a single or multiple IDL interfaces is now on one screen. This means you keep control of both sides of the extraction (COBOL side and IDL side) at any time. With the new functions **COBOL > Modify Interface** and **COBOL > Extract further Interface** in the extended context menu of the IDL file you can refine the extractions any time, allowing you to pause your work and continue later. Many other details (e.g. combo-box to switch COBOL program, find text in COBOL source, set constants for level-88 fields, IDL name prefix for FILLER etc.) have been improved.

See *COBOL Mapping Editor* in the IDL Extractor for COBOL documentation.

Context Menu for IDL Files

The context menu for IDL files in the EntireX Workbench has been simplified. It is now more compact with the most commonly used target environments - COBOL, Integration Server, Natural and Web Services - on the first menu level. Under **Other** you can select additional supported targets such as C or Java, start the IDL Tester or refactor the IDL file.

See sample *Context Menu* under *Software AG IDL File* in the IDL Editor documentation.

IDL Extractor for Integration Server

The data type mapping from Integration Server data types to IDL data types has been enhanced. This includes a changed handling of content types. See *IDL Extraction from Integration Server* in the webMethods EntireX Adapter documentation.

Extracting an IDL file for specific Integration Server services now possible. The IDL Extractor for Integration Server extracts an IDL file for all services of an Integration Server package. To extract an IDL file only for some specific Integration Server services, a new built-in service is available in the `WmEntireX` package. See *IDL Extraction from Integration Server* in the webMethods EntireX Adapter documentation.

- **License Key Layout**

The layout of the EntireX license keys has been changed. There are now fewer components and attributes. These changes were made to simplify the Software AG internal license key handling and have no impact on users.

- **PSTORE-VERSION for Persistent Store of Type DIV**

z/OS only. If you are using a persistent store of type DIV, the parameter `PSTORE-VERSION` must be set to 4. If you were using a lower version, you need to perform a cold start of your persistent store. See *Implementing a DIV Persistent Store* under *Managing the Broker Persistent Store* in the z/OS administration documentation and `PSTORE-VERSION` under *Broker Attributes*.

- **Default for Broker Attribute POLL**

As announced in the EntireX 9.6 Release Notes, the default for this attribute under z/OS has changed from YES to NO in this release. This is also the default for UNIX and z/VSE. See `POLL` under *Broker Attributes*.

Setting this attribute to YES means you can use more than the maximum number of TCP/IP connections per communicator (see *Maximum TCP/IP Connections per Communicator* under *Broker Resource Allocation* in the general administration documentation). However, `POLL=YES` increases CPU consumption, so for performance reasons we recommend `POLL=NO` unless you really need the additional TCP/IP connections.

- **natetb library on UNIX and Windows**

The load library `natetb.so` or `natetb32.dll` is no longer delivered with EntireX under UNIX and Windows. Starting with Natural 8.3.3 and NaturalONE 8.3.4, this load library is no longer needed by Natural. If you are using an earlier version of Natural or NaturalONE, you can use the `natetb` library distributed with an earlier version of EntireX.

■ **Mini Runtime**

The EntireX Mini Runtime is no longer delivered. The functionality is provided instead with EntireX libraries, which are installed using the Software AG Installer.

■ **IAF**

EntireX support for Software AG's Integrated Authentication Framework (IAF) has been dropped from all interfaces.

■ **EntireX Wrapper for Enterprise JavaBeans**

As announced in the EntireX 9.7 Release Notes, the Wrapper for EJB is no longer provided. It is no longer possible to enable Java-based components to access an EntireX RPC server using Enterprise JavaBeans.

■ **Adapter Services Wrapper for Natural**

As announced in earlier Release Notes, the Adapter Services Wrapper for Natural is no longer provided. The functionality is already covered by using the IDL Extractor for Natural and the Integration Server Wrapper.

■ **Partner Broker ID**

Partner Broker ID is no longer supported.

■ **IBM Compiler PL/I for MVS & VM**

Support for IBM compiler PL/I for MVS & VM has been dropped. Support for Enterprise PL/I for z/OS compiler will continue. This affects *PL/I Wrapper*, *Batch RPC Server* and *IMS RPC Server* in the z/OS administration documentation.

■ **Microsoft Visual Studio Wizard for EntireX DCOM Wrapper**

The Microsoft Visual Studio Wizard for EntireX DCOM Wrapper as a Software AG plug-in is no longer provided. The functionality is provided by the EntireX Workbench.

■ **Broker Control Block Definitions NATDEF12 and NATDEF21 of ACI for Natural**

The LDAs NATDEF12 and NATDEF21, which define API version 2 only, are consolidated into the LDA NATDEF. NATDEF12 and NATDEF21 are no longer provided. Use NATDEF in your application for Broker control block definition. See *ACI Examples and LDAs* in the Broker ACI for Natural documentation.

Features Dropped in Version 9.7

■ **Broker Services**

Broker Services were partially retired with EntireX version 8.0; they are now fully retired. This affects in particular the following components:

■ **Broker Services WebSphere MQ Support**

Retired since version 8.0. There was no direct replacement for the Broker Services WebSphere MQ support. However, WebSphere MQ is supported with the *EntireX WebSphere MQ RPC Server* and the *EntireX WebSphere MQ Listener*. For scenarios using the Broker Services WebSphere MQ support, both of these might be a more modern and easier-to-use alternative.

■ **Broker Services APPC Adapter**

Retired since version 8.0. There was no replacement for the Broker Services APPC Adapter. We recommend using the standard EntireX functionality in the future. Possible migration paths can vary and should be determined based on your projects.

■ **Broker Services Attach Service**

There is no replacement for the Broker Services Attach Service. Most of the RPC server implementations support multiple worker models for load balancing purposes. See for example Scenario *Worker Models* in the respective RPC server documentation. For Natural RPC servers, the Natural RPC Server front-end provides similar functionality.

■ **Location Transparency**

Support for Location Transparency was dropped in EntireX version 9.5. Location Transparency has now been removed from all major interfaces.

Java sources generated with older versions of the EntireX Wrapper for Enterprise JavaBeans do not compile with this version and newer versions of EntireX. Please re-generate these source files. It is possible to run classes based on older versions of EntireX with this version and newer versions of EntireX, as long as Location Transparency is not used.

Features Dropped in Version 9.6

■ **Operating System Support**

The following platforms are no longer supported: z/OS 1.12, z/VSE 4.3.

■ **BKIMBTSO**

Broker stub BKIMBTSO is no longer provided. The functionality is covered by stub BROKER. The default transport method for BKIMBTSO was TCP; default for BROKER is NET. However, this can be changed to TCP if required. See *Default Transport Method* under *BROKER* for BROKER under *Administering Broker Stubs* in the z/OS administration documentation.

■ **IAF**

No new version of IAF is delivered with this release of the webMethods suite.

Features Dropped in Version 9.5

■ **Location Transparency**

Location transparency is no longer supported in this version.

■ **Windows Server 2008 (32-bit)**

Windows Server 2008 (32-bit) is no longer supported. We suggest you upgrade to the 64-bit or a more recent Windows version. See [List of Components per Platform](#) for full list.

■ **JBoss**

Application server JBoss is no longer supported.

Features Dropped in Version 9.0

■ **Operating System Support**

The following operating systems are no longer supported:

- Linux 32-bit versions. We therefore recommend you migrate to the corresponding 64-bit OS version.
- Windows XP, Windows Vista, Windows 2003.
- HP-UX PA-Risc (64-bit). Applies to EntireX 9.0 only. EntireX will continue to be supported on this platform with version 8.2 until December 2016.

■ **RPC Parameters**

Configuration of RPC servers has been simplified, and the following parameters are now deprecated on some servers:

■ `runoption`

For Batch RPC Server and IMS RPC Server the complex parameter `runoption` is replaced by the new parameter `marshalling`, which is set by default to `COBOL`. `marshalling` is used together with server-side mapping files.

■ `minworker`, `maxworker`, `endworker`

For Batch RPC Server, parameters `minworker`, `maxworker` and `endworker` are replaced by new parameter `workermodel`.

See examples under [RPC Parameters](#) in section *What was New in Version 9*.

- `kernelsecurity`

The RPC server option `kernelsecurity` (KSEC under CICS) is deprecated. EntireX RPC servers now provide logic to detect the security setup of the broker kernel automatically. Applies to Batch, CICS, IMS, UNIX, Windows, Micro Focus and .NET RPC Servers.

Support for these parameters is currently still provided for compatibility reasons.

- **Broker Attributes**

The Broker attributes `NET-RESTART`, `NET-RETRY-LIMIT` and `NET-RETRY-TIME` are no longer supported.

- **DCOM Wrapper Proxy Objects**

The generation of DCOM Wrapper proxy objects is no longer supported.

- **Broker ACI for .NET**

The EntireX Broker ACI for .NET is no longer supported.

- **Broker Stubs**

Entire Net-Work is no longer supported for Broker stubs used on UNIX or Windows.

Features to be Dropped in Future Versions

The following features and platforms are not planned to be supported in future versions.

- **Encryption**

EntireX Encryption will be deprecated with the next version of EntireX. For encrypted transport we strongly recommend using the Secure Sockets Layer/Transport Layer Security protocol. See *SSL/TLS and Certificates with EntireX*.

Documentation and other appearances of EntireX Encryption (for example interfaces, configuration file) will be removed. Existing applications using EntireX Encryption will still be supported at runtime for compatibility reasons.

- **Java Message Service**

EntireX Broker support for Java Message Service (JMS) will be dropped in the next version. No replacement is planned.

- **Publish and Subscribe**

Support for EntireX Broker communication model publish and subscribe will be dropped in the next version. No replacement is planned.

- **Direct SSL/TLS Support for Broker Stubs under z/OS**

Direct SSL/TLS support (using GSK) inside the broker stubs under z/OS will be dropped in the future. We recommend using IBM's Application Transparent Transport Layer Security (AT-TLS) instead. For an overview of broker stubs and transport, see *Transport: Broker Stubs and APIs*.

- **Administration using System Management Hub and SNMP Support**

Administration with SMH (including the batch interface `argbatch`) is planned to be dropped in a future version of EntireX. The required SMH functionality will be replaced by other means. SNMP will no longer be supported when SMH is dropped.

- **COBOL Wrapper**

The Generic RPC Services Modules (see *Generic RPC Services Module*) COBSRVIB and COBSRVID delivered on mainframe will be moved to the examples in the next version. For your integration scenarios, use the modules generated by the EntireX Workbench. The CICS module COBSRVIC in source as well as load format will stay.

- **WebSphere MQ RPC Server and Listener**

Support for dynamic IDL/RPC parameters will be dropped in a future version. See *Dynamic IDL/RPC Parameters* for WebSphere MQ RPC Server | Listener. No replacement is planned.

When archiving an EntireX project with the export feature of Eclipse or the check-in feature of a revision control system such as Subversion or CVS, you can use an external properties file to store the properties of your IDL files. These properties are restored from this external file when the project is imported or checked out. See *Storing IDL Properties in an External File* under *EntireX Workbench*.

Support of Eclipse 4.3

Eclipse version 4.3 is now supported.

IDL Extractor for COBOL

Before you use the IDL Extractor for COBOL, make sure you have installed all the available fixes for the EntireX Eclipse plug-ins.

RPC Server Changes and Enhancements

Automatic Syncpoint Handling

The CICS and IMS RPC servers automatically issue a `SYNCPPOINT` under certain circumstances. See *Automatic Syncpoint Handling* in the respective RPC server documentation.

The configuration parameter `SYNCPPOINT` is now deprecated.

Broker Enhancements

Internationalization

Simplified ICU Conversion

For *ICU Conversion* under *Introduction to Internationalization*, SAGTRPC detects single-byte codepages automatically and converts them quickly and efficiently in one step from source to target encoding. This means that for single-byte codepages, SAGTRPC is the same as SAGTCHA, which simplifies the internationalization approach ICU Conversion:

- For *ACI-based Programming* there is no change: configure SAGTCHA as in previous versions of EntireX.
- For *RPC-based Components* and *Reliable RPC*, always configure SAGTRPC: complex codepages such as multibyte, double-byte, EBCDIC stateful, Hebrew 803, as well as Arabic shaping are always handled correctly, and for single-byte scenarios, throughput has been enhanced.

There is no need to reconfigure ICU conversion in your existing environment; your settings for ICU conversion will continue to work. Moreover, if SAGTRPC is defined in your environment but not really needed because all your RPC components use single-byte codepages only, broker throughput should increase and you should get better response times.

For conversion, set the service-specific or topic-specific broker attribute `CONVERSION` in the attribute file.

On-error Trace for ICU Conversion

For *ICU Conversion* under *Introduction to Internationalization*, both SAGTCHA and SAGTRPC provide an on-error trace. See `TRACE` option of the service-specific or topic-specific broker attribute `CONVERSION` in the attribute file.

A new configuration property `entirex.wmqbridge.priority` is provided for the EntireX WebSphere MQ RPC Server and the WebSphere MQ Listener to specify a message priority that is different from the default. High Availability

Under High Availability we understand an environment with engineered redundancy which, if any one component fails, guarantees the integrity of the system as a whole. To achieve high availability, EntireX uses existing third-party clustering technology.

Simplified Configuration for DIV Persistent Store

The persistent store handler for Data In Virtual (DIV) has been enhanced. Set `PSTORE-VERSION=4` to use the new handler, which requires much less configuration data. See `PSTORE-VERSION`.

RPC Parameters

New parameters are available to simplify configuration of RPC servers:

- `marshalling`
For Batch RPC Server and IMS RPC Server, new parameter `marshalling` is used together with server-side mapping files and replaces the complex parameter `runoption`, which is now deprecated.
- `workermodel`
For Batch RPC Server, new parameter `workermodel` replaces parameters `minworker`, `maxworker` and `endworker`, which are now deprecated.

Examples:

```
Workermodel=(SCALE, 1,5,fastshrink) replaces MinWorker=1; MaxWorker=5;  
                                         EndWorker=Immediately
```

```
Workermodel=(SCALE, 3,10,slowshrink) replaces MinWorker=3; MaxWorker=10;

```



```
WorkerModel=(FIX, 4)                replaces MinWorker=4; MaxWorker=4;
                                     EndWorker=Never
```

To reflect these new parameters, a new configuration file is provided. See member `CONFIG` in the source library `EXP990.SRCE`. All deprecated parameters are still supported, but may be dropped in a future version; there is currently no need to adapt your configuration file, although this is recommended.

Dynamic Memory Management

Dynamic memory management is a feature to handle changing Broker workload without any restart of the Broker task. It increases the availability of the Broker by using various memory pools for various Broker resources and by being able to use a variable number of pools for the resources. This feature was available in previous versions of EntireX but is now activated by default. See *Dynamic Memory Management* under *Broker Resource Allocation* in the general administration documentation and `DYNAMIC-MEMORY-MANAGEMENT` under *Broker Attributes*.

Specifying poolsize using Java System Property

Parameter `poolsize` for specifying the maximum number of socket connections with Java-based EntireX applications can now be set using the new Java property `entirex.socket.poolsize`. See *Socket Parameters for TCP and SSL/TLS Communication* under *Writing Advanced Applications - EntireX Java ACI*.

RPC Security

The Batch, CICS, IMS, UNIX, Windows, Micro Focus and .NET RPC Servers now provide logic to detect the security setup of the broker kernel automatically. This means the RPC server option `KERNELSECURITY` (`KSEC` under CICS) is now deprecated. The parameter is currently still supported for reasons of compatibility.

EntireX and the Cloud

Amazon Elastic Compute Cloud (Amazon EC2) is a web service that provides resizable compute capacity in the cloud. It is designed to make web-scale computing easier for developers. EntireX supports Amazon EC2 on the following platforms:

- Windows Server 2008 Standard and Enterprise editions (64-bit)
- Red Hat Enterprise Linux Server 6

Additional Authorization Call to EntireX Security

An additional authorization check is now performed for a user against a specified application in a RACF security environment. This prevents, for example, a password being revoked for a user who does not have access at all to a particular application. See `APPLICATION-NAME`.

Support of UsernameToken

The XML/SOAP RPC Server uses UsernameToken security for a Web service if the configuration contains the attribute `usernameToken` in `<xmm>`. The XML/SOAP RPC Server supports two kinds of UsernameToken:

- PasswordText
- PasswordDigest

IDL Tester

In earlier versions, the IDL Tester cluttered up your projects with multiple Java assets. These assets are now generated into your temp directory and are removed automatically when the Designer is shut down. The Java Wrapper can still generate test classes into a Java project if required.

COBOL Wrapper

You can now customize the names for the generated COBOL client interface objects. See *Customize Automatically Generated Client Names* under *Generating COBOL Source Files from Software AG IDL Files*.

You can also customize the names for the generated COBOL server. See *Customize Automatically Generated Server Names* under *Generating COBOL Source Files from Software AG IDL Files*.

For IDL unbounded arrays (see *array-definition* under *Software AG IDL Grammar* in the *IDL Editor* documentation under *Software AG IDL Grammar* in the *IDL Editor* documentation) which are mapped to COBOL tables with the `DEPENDING ON` clause (see *COBOL Tables with Variable Size - DEPENDING ON Clause*), index variables in the `LINKAGE SECTION` of client interface objects and server skeletons are generated unsigned, that is, with the data format `PIC 9(8) BINARY` instead of `PIC 9 S(8) BINARY`. Natural Wrapper

The Natural Wrapper allows you to customize the names for the generated Natural client interface objects and to enable/disable - for each IDL program - the generation of Natural client test programs. The Natural Wrapper also generates RPC servers; you can customize the names for these. See *Using the Natural Wrapper for the Server Side within NaturalONE*.

There are no longer any restrictions in IDL program names; these can be longer than eight characters or even contain characters not allowed in Natural names. The names are adapted during wrapping.

IDL Extractor for XML Document

Option combinations that do not match the selected target programming language are disabled and cannot be selected. See *Step 3: Select the Integration Server Package to Extract*.

XML Mapping Editor

SOAP mapping with mapping parameter `Generate Array Envelope Element` has been changed: The generation for simple type arrays also respects the setting of this parameter. To enable the old behavior (arrays of type simple always get a wrapping element) add the following line to `eclipse.ini`:

New ACI Version 10

With this new ACI version you can define a variable-sized `BROKER-ID`, the so-called `LONG-BROKER-ID`. The ACI structure contains the new field `LONG-BROKER-ID-LENGTH`. If the value of this field is non-zero, specify the value of the `LONG-BROKER-ID` directly after the ACI control block. The `LONG-BROKER-ID` overrides any `BROKER-ID` value.

With the `LONG-BROKER-ID` you can now specify numeric IPv6 addresses. See *LONG-BROKER-ID-LENGTH* under *Broker ACI Fields*.

IDMSETB

A new broker stub is provided to support IDMS/DC. See *IDMSETB* under *Administering Broker Stubs* under *Administering Broker Stubs* in the z/OS administration documentation and *Using the COBOL Wrapper for IDMS/DC with Call Interfaces (z/OS)*.

Support of IPv6

SSL and TCP/IP transport is now supported in IPv4 and IPv6 networks. Mixed IPv4 and IPv6 scenarios are also supported. See *IPV6*.

New API RPC-CNTX

Modified Codepage Handling with CICS ECI RPC Server and IMS Connect RPC Server

The CICS ECI RPC Server and IMS Connect RPC Server now use only the encoding specified with the parameter `entirex.bridge.targetencoding` when communicating with the EntireX Broker. This behavior is new in this version. Make sure you have enabled conversion in the Broker attribute file so the data can be converted correctly. This is typically achieved by setting service-specific attribute `CONVERSION` to "SAGTCHA".

See `entirex.bridge.targetencoding` under *Configuring the CICS ECI Side* | *Configuring the IMS Connect Side* in the IMS Connect RPC Server documentation in the respective RPC server documentation.

CICS RPC Server

A user exit is provided to influence/control the logic of the CICS RPC Server. See *User Exit COBUEX02* under *Administering the EntireX RPC Server* in the CICS RPC Server documentation.

Job Names and Transaction IDs in SMF Records

Broker ACI field `APPLICATION-NAME` has been enhanced to improve logging and accounting. If the program that issued the broker call is running on a mainframe system, the eight-byte job name is used as application name. If the job name is shorter than eight bytes, it is padded with underscore characters. If the z/OS program issuing the broker call is running in a TP monitor (except IDMS/DC), a dash sign is set as ninth byte. The following eight bytes from position 10-17 contain monitor-dependent data. See `APPLICATION-NAME` for details.

Whitespace Handling in the XML/SOAP Runtime

The default handling for preserving whitespace in XML and Web services scenarios has been enhanced. The XML/SOAP Runtime trims whitespace in values by default. The whitespace handling is also determined by defining attribute `xml:space` (see XML specification) on element(s). The attribute `xml:space` has the higher priority and is inherited from children of the element recursively. See *Whitespace Handling* under *Writing Advanced Applications with the XML/SOAP Wrapper*.

Administration Service Commands

The administration service monitors and controls all local brokers; remote brokers can also be monitored. The administration service is addressed via the System Management Hub or the administration service command-line utility `etbsrv`. To run the commands from utility `etbsrv`, System Management Hub is not required. This feature was designed to be used in a clustering environment, but can also be used in a standard environment.

License Key Handling under z/OS

Under z/OS, the EntireX Broker no longer starts up if the license key is invalid.
